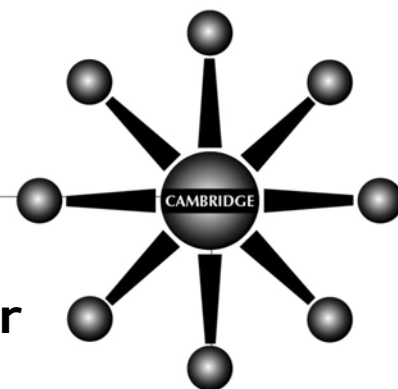

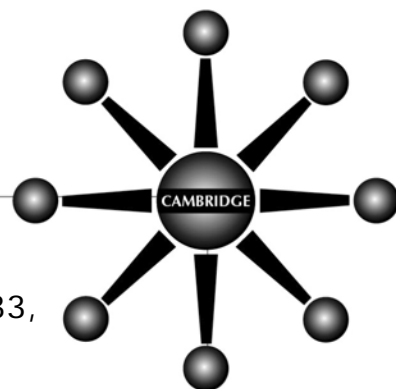
Launch of New Generation Forum for Greater Cambridge
